Key points

The University of Law is a specialist provider, with 15 campuses across the UK, an online campus and two international campuses. Our undergraduate provision is small and relatively new. Our undergraduate student body is well over 50% BME and 35% of our students are high potential students.

- **Financial support:** expand our offer to include bursaries in addition to hardship funding, and increase our financial advice support

Students are represented in our Widening Participation and Access Committee, and all its working groups, which work to oversee the implementation of the plan and deliver activities to achieve its aims.

Evaluation – how we will measure what we have achieved

The University of Law uses evidence to inform what we do and to monitor if we are on track to achieve our access and participation aims. We collect data and feedback to do the following:

- Evaluate the activities we deliver
- Identify the impact of the activities on our targets
- Evaluate the impact of our financial support
- Identify if the activity we deliver is value for money

Our Data, Research and Evaluation working group monitors the delivery of access and participation activities and the progress of our work against the targets in our access and participation plan. We work collaboratively with higher education sector organisations to ensure our evaluation is rigorous and objective.
