## Student Intellectual Property Policy

### 1 Introduction

- 1.1 This Intellectual Property Policy (“the **Policy**”) defines the rights and responsibilities of University of Law students (“**Students**”) in respect of intellectual property they may create and/or use in the course of their studies through the University of Law (“**ULaw**”).
- 1.2 As a general principle, ULaw recognises that Students should own the intellectual property rights in any work that they produce as part of their course of study (subject to the exceptions set out in clause 6.1 of this Policy).
- 1.3 This Policy applies to all enrolled students at ULaw and has effect from March 2021 until its next
